

Outstanding Q&A from 7/24/2026 Alameda CalAIM PATH Collaborative

Alameda Alliance for Health responded to a number of questions live during the July 24, 2026 Alameda CalAIM PATH Collaborative meeting. The following questions were not addressed at that time due to time constraints, and Alameda Alliance for Health has provided written responses to each.

"Lots of our members don't qualify for coordinated entry but are in need of housing. Can you help me understand what CS I should reach out to for them?"

211 has access to lists of resources, in collaboration with Housing Resource Centers, that can provide additional options. At this time, if members are not eligible for coordinated entry placement, they will not be connected to our housing community supports programs. Additionally, coordinated entry enrollment does not guarantee that members will be connected to our housing community supports programs either, as enrollment is dependent on various factors, such as provider capacity, member acuity, and housing resource prioritization and availability.

"My understanding is that the 211/Coordinated Entry process and the updated AAH Housing Referral Form should be completed at the same time. Is that correct? If so, when will this process take effect, and who are the current housing providers?"

We continue to encourage referrals via the 211/Coordinated Entry process. When the new referral form is available, you may refer to both the Alliance and 211 at the same time – while the Alliance will not have visibility nor make decisions on behalf of the Coordinated Entry system, the Alliance will log your referral and potentially link members to additional resources as they navigate the coordinated entry process. However, you are not required to complete the Alliance referral form to access 211/Coordinated Entry. Please note that when we receive the referral form for housing community supports, we will advise you to contact 211 or visit a housing resource center.
